

KSCMP Practice Review Notification Process

A child has been abused or neglected, the local authority must notify the CSPRP if:

- the child dies or is seriously harmed in the local authority's area, or
- while normally resident in the local authority's area, the child dies or is seriously harmed outside England.

Yes — this will always result in a Rapid Review

Local Authority Serious Incident Notification to the CSPRP by ICS (signed off by the Corporate Director for CYPE) within 5 days of the incident

ICS submit ePR Notification to KSCMP

KSCMP commence a Rapid Review with (15 working days to complete from the date of notification)

KSCMP Rapid Review Group meeting held to discuss the case

KSCMP Rapid Review Group decision will be made by the Police, Local Authority and Health representatives

KSCMP report the outcome and decision of the Rapid Review Group meeting to the CSPRP

Where agreed, proportionate Practice Review commissioned, undertaken, overseen and monitored by the Rapid Review Group

Review signed off by the Executive Board

Review findings shared with CSPRP and published

No — this will not be a Rapid Review

The case should be discussed with the Agency Safeguarding Lead before considering making an LCSPR notification

If the case meet the WT 2018 criteria for a LCSPR, an ePR Notification is made to KSCMP

The Notification is presented to the Practice Review (PR) Group for consideration

The PR Group will decide if the case requires the undertaking of a proportionate LCSPR

The report the outcome and decision of the PR Group meeting to the Executive Board

Where agreed, proportionate Practice Review commissioned, undertaken, overseen and monitored by the PR Group

Review findings shared with Executive Board and learning published
