Overview

The programme is developed to give a range of necessary multi-agency topics, as well as deliver learning derived from practice reviews.

Core courses are those which cover learning which is integral to safeguarding children foundation knowledge.

The courses are set across three levels:

- 1 – introductory
- 2 – understanding and application
- 3 – advanced and specialist.

All training content can be accessed via the KSCMP MeLearning portal, including e-learning, recorded webinars, and course bookings. Most KSCMP courses are free of charge to attend, there are a small number of courses which do have a small charge for materials associated to the course. Where there is a cost for attendance this is indicated both in the course description in this catalogue, and also when booking a space in the portal. Given the limited number of training spaces available for a large professional workforce in Kent, KSCMP does have a non-attendance fee for courses, details of which are provided when booking a space on course.

KSCMP underpins the learning from the programme through a range of broader supporting resources, including factsheets, video explainers, and practice resources. All of these are available in the 'Training and Resources' section of the KSCMP website.

Training administration charge

From **1st April 2026** a **£50 training administration charge** will apply for attendance at most KSCMP face-to-face and virtual delivered courses, for any learner who is from an organisation that does not financially contribute to the Partnership.

Non-attendance charge

<p>Allegation Management: The Role of the LADO</p> <p>Delivered by the Kent County LADO Service, this session has been developed for managers and designated practitioners working across the children and young people’s workforce in Kent. It will identify the relevant procedures that should be used in respect of all cases in connection with the persons employment, or voluntary activity where it is alleged that a person who works with children and young people has:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Behaved in a way that has harmed a child or young person, or may have harmed a child or young person • Possibly committed a criminal offence against or related to a child or young person • Behaved towards a child or young person in a way that indicates they may pose a risk of harm • Behaved in a way that indicated they may not be suitable to work with children. 	2	Virtual via MS Teams	Yes
<p>Child Exploitation</p> <p>This virtual session equips professionals with the knowledge and tools to recognise and respond to child exploitation. Participants will explore the various forms of exploitation, understand grooming and exploitation models, and examine the factors that heighten vulnerability. The course also provides practical guidance on using the Kent and Medway Child Exploitation Identification Tool and outlines key policy and legislation relevant to safeguarding children. By the end of the session, attendees will be confident in identifying risks and taking informed actions to protect children and young people.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	Yes

<p>Channel Panel Induction</p> <p>This course will provide an overview of Channel in Kent and Medway and equip learners with the tools to represent their organisation. The course looks at legislation and the Channel Duty Guidance, Channel in Kent and Medway, local & national threats and risks, Channel statistics and emerging extremist ideologies, case studies, expectations of attendees, how to contribute to Channel panel decisions, and the Prevent referral pathway.</p>	3	Virtual via MS Teams	No
<p>Channel Panel Understanding with Thresholds</p> <p>Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Team this course covers legislation and guidance, Channel in Kent and Medway, local and national threats and risks, Channel statistics and emerging extremist ideologies, online radicalisation and how it manifests and real-life Channel case studies.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	No
<p>Child Safeguarding Basic Awareness</p> <p>By attending this course practitioners will be able to increase their understanding of who KSCMP are, as well as law and guidance relevant to safeguarding children, types of child abuse, how to recognise and respond to child abuse, information sharing and consent, and practice reviews.</p>	2	Face-to-face	Yes

<p>Child Safeguarding for Designated Practitioners</p> <p>By attending this half-day virtual course practitioners will be able to increase their understanding of key legislation and guidance, the responsibilities of a designated practitioner, Kent support levels, information and data protection, safer recruitment and allegations against staff, supervision and training, and local practice reviews. This course is aimed at designated practitioners or safeguarding leads and therefore assumes an existing level of safeguarding knowledge. This course does not cover specific responsibilities for education settings as outlined in Keeping Children Safe in Education.</p>	3	Virtual via MS Teams	Yes
<p>Child Safeguarding Refresher</p> <p>This course offers attendees a short refresher on KSCMP, law and guidance relevant to safeguarding children, types of child abuse, recognising and responding to child abuse and information sharing. <p>Child Sexual Abuse</p> <p>This course is designed for learners to understand what child sexual abuse, child sexual exploitation and online child sexual abuse is and have an insight into perpetrators child sexual abuse and the grooming cycle often employed by abusers. Practitioners will also understand what positions of trust are and the specific measures that apply to them, be able to identify or recognise indicators and signs of child sexual abuse, know how to respond appropriately, and be familiar with the Kent and Medway Child Sexual Abuse Medical Pathways and other relevant legislation, policy, tools and resources.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	Yes

<p>Cumulative Harm seminar On Wednesday 5th February 2025, KSCMP hosted a virtual seminar on Cumulative Harm. The seminar explored what cumulative harm is and how it can be identified, as well as the implications for the wellbeing of children. The seminar shared learning identified in the Jasper Red Local Child Safeguarding Practice Review, as well as other practice reviews, and good practice on recognising and responding to Cumulative Harm.</p>	2	Recorded	No
<p>EatSafe: Safer Eating in Early Years Settings EatSafe is a KSCMP campaign to support safer eating of children in early years non-familial settings. This recorded webinar explores the EatSafe principles and resources. Learners will gain understanding of the TRUSTS Cycle, including the need to understand each child and their stage, not age, as well as how to develop an organisational culture which promotes safer eating and safeguarding mealtimes for children.</p>	2	Recorded webinar	No
<p>Elective Home Education (EHE) Delivered by KCC's Elective Home Education Team, this recorded webinar covers what EHE is, how EHE is monitored by the local authority, and, how the EHE Team work together with other agencies to ensure children and young people are kept safe.</p>	1	Recorded webinar	No

<p>Extremist Ideology Overview</p> <p>An awareness session to increase knowledge of extremist ideology. The session will cover identifying extremist ideologies, recognising the characteristics of extremist ideologies, non-ideological factors that may contribute to terrorism, how complex needs interplay with extremist ideologies, when an individual expressing an extremist ideology should be referred to Prevent and the Prevent referral pathway.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	No
<p>Extremist Ideology – Emerging and Other Extremist Ideologies</p> <p>This session will define emerging and other extremist ideologies as well as identify the characteristics of emerging and other ideologies. It will cover contemporary manifestations of emerging and other extremist ideologies, analyse how emerging and other extremist ideologies can motivate terrorism, make informed judgements on whether an individual should be referred to Prevent and the Prevent referral pathway.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	No
<p>Extremist Ideology – Extreme Right Wing</p> <p>An awareness session to increase knowledge of extreme right ring ideology. The session will define extreme right wing ideology, identify defining characteristics, recognise contemporary manifestations, understand how extreme right wing ideology can motivate terrorism, make informed judgements on whether an individual should be referred to Prevent and the Prevent referral pathway.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	No

<p>Extremist Identities Online & Online Spaces Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Team this workshop looks at extremist use of online spaces, including social media and online gaming, how extremists tailor narratives to online audiences, disinformation and de-mystifying memes and terminology.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	No
<p>InCels: Online Subculture and Misogyny Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Team this course covers who InCels are, timelines of the InCel 'movement', associated online culture and misogyny, backgrounds and beliefs, terminology, InCels and extremism, local context and the Prevent referral pathway.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	No
<p>Impact of Parent Mental Health on Children seminar In June 2025 the KSCMP hosted a seminar considering the impact of parent mental health on children. It covered relevant learning from local and national practice reviews, reframing children as protective factors, young carer awareness, and a school perspective on the impact on children and their education. The seminar also launched KSCMP's 'I'm Lucy' resources which aim to highlight that children should not be considered protective factors for their parents' mental health.</p>	2	Recorded	No

<p>Introduction to Childhood Neglect</p> <p>This course aims to build awareness and understanding of neglect and to explore approaches and next steps to better safeguard children by early identification of neglect. Learners will gain knowledge to recognise signs and symptoms of neglect, understand the definition of neglect and concept of cumulative harm, and explore responses to neglect.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	Yes
<p>Online Safety</p> <p>This course enables delegates to understand how the online world can impact children and young people, both positively and negatively, and how to access advice and support to better keep children safe online.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	Yes
<p>Prevent Awareness and Radicalisation</p> <p>Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Team this interactive awareness session covers relevant strategy and legislation, including CONTEST, the Counter Terrorism and Security Act and the Prevent Duty, as well as both national and Kent and Medway counter terrorism context and threats. The course also considers terrorist ideologies and narratives, radicalisation and vulnerability factors, and the Prevent referral pathway.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	No

<p>Private Fostering Delivered by Kent County Council Integrated Children Service, this course is for professionals working with children to enable them to understand what a private fostering arrangement is and their duties if becoming aware of a private fostering arrangement. It will also enable a better understanding of risks and vulnerabilities or privately fostered children, the role and duties of the local authority in regarding to private fostering and where to get further advice and guidance.</p>	2	Virtual via MS Teams	Yes
<p>Providing Agency Reports for Practice Review This webinar is designed for practice review leads and those who author agency reports for Local Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews (LCSPRs). It covers the purpose of LCSPRs, responsibilities of individual agencies in providing information for LCSPRs, and how to provide high quality agency reports which contribute to understanding learning.</p>	3	Recorded webinar	No
<p>Public Law Outline and Pre-Proceedings Delivered by Kent County Council Integrated Children’s Service this webinar provides understanding of the Public Law Outline (PLO) also known as pre-proceedings. <p>Repot Writing for Child Protection Conferences</p> <p>This course provides guidance on writing reports for Child Protection conferences in Kent. It covers what Child Protection conferences are & different types, the Stronger Families, Safer Children approach used in Kent, the purpose of Child Protection conference reports, and the structure, format and content of Child Protection conference reports.</p>	3	Recorded webinar	No
<p>Risk of Harm to Children from Pets seminar</p> <p>In April 2025 the KSCMP hosted a virtual seminar which explored potential risks of harm to children from pets and drew on local learning and experience, as well as good practice. Bespoke Training

Currently we offer bespoke training for the following courses:

- Introduction to Childhood Neglect
- Child Exploitation.

Costs

A half-day workshop is charged at £600.

A full-day workshop (which may comprise up to 2 of the above courses) is charged at £1100.
