Canterbury is the 8 th most deprived district in Kent and 185 th in
	England. The Canterbury district has three main residential centres, Canterbury city, Whitstable and Herne Bay, as well large rural area consisting of 41 villages. It has a unique position as the economic centre for East Kent with several important sectors include retail, hotels, catering, health and education sectors although many of these may be part-time and lower paid jobs. Thanet lies at the eastern end of Kent with three main coastal towns of Margate, Ramsgate and Broadstairs. Thanet's Population is around 141,500 with a dense urban centre which forms an almost continuous belt around the north east coast over around 40 miles. Thanet continues to have an older age profile with 55% being over 40. The district is ranked as the 34h most deprived district out of 317 authorities in England, and with the highest average proportion of households in poverty within Kent. Average skills levels of Thanet's residents are lower than the rest of Kent and England, with unemployment levels (claimant count 2012) at 6.2%, twice that of Kent.
