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Overview

The programme is developed to give a range of necessary multi-agency topics, as well as deliver learning derived from practice reviews.

Core courses are those which cover learning which is integral to safeguarding children foundation knowledge.

The courses are set across three levels:

- 1 – introductory
- 2 – understanding and application
- 3 – advanced and specialist.

All training content can be accessed via the KSCMP MeLearning portal, including e-learning, recorded webinars, and course bookings. Most KSCMP courses are free of charge to attend, there are a small number of courses which do have a small charge for materials associated to the course. Where there is a cost for attendance this is indicated both in the course description in this catalogue, and also when booking a space in the portal. Given the limited number of training spaces available for a large professional workforce in Kent, KSCMP does have a non-attendance fee for courses, details of which are provided when booking a space on course.

KSCMP underpins the learning from the programme through a range of broader supporting resources, including factsheets, video explainers, and practice resources. All of these are available in the 'Training and Resources' section of the KSCMP website.

Abuse Related to Beliefs in Witchcraft

The course will help you identify children at risk of witchcraft abuse. It covers belief and abuse, risk factors, and challenges for professionals.

This course will explore signs and symptoms of self-neglect and hoarding, recognising when you should be concerned about an individual, how to respond and understanding Safeguarding Adult Reviews.

The course explores the negative effects of bullying in any form, including cyber-bullying, and teaches positive strategies and solutions for those working with young people who experience bullying.

This course looks at which child sexual exploitation means, typical offender behaviour and the impact of CSE on victims, as well as how to spot the warning signs.

This course looks at the different types of FGM, why it happens, the impact on individuals and societies, and how professionals can prevent it and support those affected.

This course will provide actionable knowledge to help keep yourself and others safe, including identifying the causes of fire, and the proper use of extinguishers.

Framework for the Assessment of Children and their Families

This course explores an assessment framework to provide evidence to help, guide and inform judgements about children's welfare and safety from the first point of contact, through the processes of assessment, planning and review.

This course provides an overview of gangs and youth violence, helping you to understand what gangs are and what they do, the part women and girls play in gangs and what can be done to prevent gang recruitment.

This course provides learning about the Prevent Strategy and Channel process and what you should do if you believe that someone you know is vulnerable to being exploited or radicalised.

This course is intended for those who work in the education sector or could potentially make safeguarding referrals to the local authority children's service.

This course is for staff and students who might come into contact with or who have occasional contact with children or vulnerable adults as part of their work/placement. It explains how to recognise abuse, reduce the risk of abuse and what to do if you suspect abuse or abuse is disclosed to you.

Safeguarding Children in Sport

This course examines the roles of people who come into contact with children through sport. It describes the different types of abuse and considers what can be done to ensure abuse is recognised, stopped and prevented.

This course covers the definition of disability, why disabled children are more vulnerable to abuse and recognise the challenges faced when abuse is suspected.

This course has been developed in line with the Department for Education's Keeping Children Safe in Education guidance. It provides information on the recruitment of staff or volunteers in organisations that provide services for children.

Understanding Child Safeguarding



Child Safeguarding Basic Awareness

By attending this course practitioners will be able to increase their understanding of who KSCMP are, as well as law and guidance relevant to safeguarding children, types of child abuse, how to recognise and respond to child abuse, information sharing and consent, and practice reviews.

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Child Safeguarding for Designated Practitioners

By attending this half-day virtual course practitioners will be able to increase their understanding of key legislation and guidance, the responsibilities of a designated practitioner, Kent support levels, information and data protection, safer recruitment and allegations against staff, supervision and training, and local practice reviews. This course is aimed at designated practitioners or safeguarding leads and therefore assumes an existing level of safeguarding knowledge. This course does not cover specific responsibilities for education settings as outlined in Keeping Children Safe in Education.

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Child Safeguarding Refresher

This course offers attendees a short refresher on KSCMP, law and guidance relevant to safeguarding children, types of child abuse, recognising and responding to child abuse and information sharing. It assumes an existing level of safeguarding knowledge.

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Understanding the Kent Support Levels Guidance (launching in Spring 2024)

Delivered by KCC Integrated Children's Services this course provides learners with an overview of the Kent Support Levels Guidance and how to apply it to work with children to understand at which level a child's needs sit. It explores the types of support available at each level, when a Request for Support (RfS) will be required, gaining consent, and how to submit a RfS.

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Child Safeguarding Themes and Risks



Child Sexual Abuse

This course is designed for learners to understand what child sexual abuse, child sexual exploitation and online child sexual abuse is and have an insight into perpetrators child sexual abuse and the grooming cycle often employed by abusers. Practitioners will also understand what positions of trust are and the specific measures that apply to them, be able to identify or recognise indicators and signs of child sexual abuse, know how to respond appropriately, and be familiar with the Kent and Medway Child Sexual Abuse Medical Pathways and other relevant legislation, policy, tools and resources.

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Contextual Safeguarding

Delivered by Kent County Council Integrated Children Service, this course provides an introduction and overview of the contextual safeguarding approach, how you can apply contextual safeguarding to your practice and explore challenges in the current system.

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Child Exploitation Intelligence Portal (eIntel)

Delivered by Kent Police this webinar explores types of child exploitation and how to submit relevant intelligence via the updated Child Exploitation Intelligence Portal (eIntel).

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Online Safety

Delivered by the Kent County Council's Education Safeguarding Service this course enables delegates to understand how the online world can impact children and young people, both positively and negatively, and how to access advice and support to better keep children safe online.

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Prevent Awareness and Radicalisation

Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Team this interactive awareness session covers relevant strategy and legislation, including CONTEST, the Counter Terrorism and Security Act and the Prevent Duty, as well as both national and Kent and Medway counter terrorism context and threats. The course also considers terrorist ideologies and narratives, radicalisation and vulnerability factors, and the Prevent referral pathway.

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Channel Panel Understanding

Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Team this course covers legislation and guidance, Channel in Kent and Medway, local and national threats and risks, Channel statistics and emerging extremist ideologies, online radicalisation and how it manifests and real-life Channel case studies.

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Domestic Abuse and Extremism

Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Team this course will cover the links between domestic abuse and extremism, spotting the signs of domestic abuse linked with extremism, up to date research from 2022 and the Prevent referral pathway.

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Extremist Identities Online and Online Space

Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Team this workshop looks at extremist use of online spaces, including social media and online gaming, how extremists tailor narratives to online audiences, disinformation and de-mystifying memes and terminology.

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InCels: Online Subculture and Misogyny

Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Team this course covers who InCels are, timelines of the InCel 'movement', associated online culture and misogyny, backgrounds and beliefs, terminology, InCels and extremism, local context and the Prevent referral pathway.

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Kent and Medway Education Settings Workshop to Raise Awareness of the Prevent Safeguarding and Local Context

Delivered by the Kent and Medway Prevent Education Officers, this session is for individuals working in education settings and suitable for all staff and governors. It is designed to build understanding of the Prevent Strategy and education professionals' roles within it by developing existing expertise and professional judgement to recognise individuals who may be susceptible to radicalisation and provide a clear picture of the risks and threats both nationally and locally.

This course is only for individuals who are not able to attend sessions booked for their education establishment. If training is required for multiple staff or a whole setting, the Prevent Education Officers should be contacted.

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EatSafe: Safer Eating in Early Years Settings (available from 20th February 2024)

EatSafe is a KSCMP campaign to support safer eating of children in early years non-familial settings. This recorded webinar explores the EatSafe principles and resources. Learners will gain understanding of the TRUSTS Cycle, including the need to understand each child and their stage, not age, as well as how to develop an organisational culture which promotes safer eating and safeguarding mealtimes for children.

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Learning from Baby T: Exploring Safer Sleep

This workshop explores learning from the Baby T Local Child Safeguarding Practice Review. Designed for frontline practitioners in all agencies who work with babies and families the workshop covers Safer Sleep principles, exploring parent understanding and application of principles, and understanding contextual factors that may impact on Safer Sleep for infants.

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Youth Mental Health First Aid (two-day course)

This two day course trains attendees as a Youth Mental Health First Aider. It gives an in-depth understanding of young people's mental health and factors that affect wellbeing, practical skills to spot the triggers and signs of mental health issues, and confidence to reassure and support a young person in distress. It also explores enhanced interpersonal skills such as non-judgemental listening and tools to look after your own mental wellbeing.

Everyone who completes the course will receive a certificate of attendance to state you are a Youth Mental Health First Aider, a Youth Mental Health First Aid manual to refer to whenever you need it, and a workbook including helpful tools.

Professional Skills and Knowledge



Allegation Management: The Role of the LADO

Delivered by the Kent County LADO Service, this session has been developed for managers and designated practitioners working across the children and young people's workforce in Kent. It will identify the relevant procedures that should be used in respect of all cases in connection with the persons employment, or voluntary activity where it is alleged that a person who works with children and young people has:

- Behaved in a way that has harmed a child or young person, or may have harmed a child or young person
- Possibly committed a criminal offence against or related to a child or young person
- Behaved towards a child or young person in a way that indicates they may pose a risk of harm
- Behaved in a way that indicated they may not be suitable to work with children.

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Core Skills

Delivered by Kent County Council Integrated Children Service, this course will explore KCC's 'Kent Practice Framework'. This is used by practitioners across ICS and contains the principles, approaches, theories and models that inform the work with children, young people and families.

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Father Inclusive Practice

This webinar provides learners with understanding of the value of paternal involvement to children, why father inclusivity is essential practice, what father inclusive practice means, and the Kent Father Inclusive Guidance.

Designed for frontline practitioners working with children and families, this course explores the role bias can play in assessments and understanding of family dynamic, by exploring personal beliefs and expectations. The discussions will examine how we measure risk to children from different backgrounds.

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Private Fostering

It covers the Serious Incident Notification pathway, statutory requirements and timeframes, providing effective agency involvement summaries, format, membership and purpose of the Rapid Review, attendee responsibilities, and Rapid Review outcomes, learning and action plans.

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Providing Agency Reports for Practice Reviews

This webinar is designed for practice review leads and those who author agency reports for Local Child Safeguarding Practice Reviews (LCSPRs). It covers the purpose of LCSPRs, responsibilities of individual agencies in providing information for LCSPRs, and how to provide high quality agency reports which contribute to understanding learning.
